



Game Forecast

Marshall College of Huntington, W. Va., is meeting the John Carroll Blue Streaks tonight in the latter's opening home game of the 1949 season. Home from a long road trip which included one intersectional tilt and three matches inside the state, the Streaks will be encountering the Marshall Thundering Herd for the third time in a series which began in 1927.

So far the record stands at a tie and a victory for Carroll. The first contest resulted in a 6-6 deadlock when a Marshall back intercepted a pass and went 90 yards for the equalizer, this in old Luna Park in Cleveland. Last year on Marshall's home field, the Streaks won handily, 20-6.

Next Friday night, October 28, again at the Cleveland Stadium, Carroll goes against a tough Bowling Green team which went undefeated in ten games last year. The only blot on the Falcon record was a 13-13 tie with the Streaks, a game that provided four periods of bitterly-contested football. Carroll has yet to taste defeat from the Falcon gridders, the series standing at two victories and the tie.

Jicket Information

Tickets for the remaining three home games of the Streaks can be purchased at the John Carroll University Ticket Office, located in the lobby of the Administration Building on the university campus at Miramar and Carroll Blvds., University Heights 18, O. Tickets can also be obtained at the ticket office of Richman Brothers, 736 Euclid Ave., in downtown Cleveland, during the week of each home game. For Carroll's final away game with Canisius College of Buffalo, N. Y., tickets can be purchased at the university.

Ticket prices are as follows:

- (1) \$2.50 box and reserved seats—upper deck (reserved seats are the first six rows behind boxes).
- (2) \$2 reserved seats—upper deck, all sections.
- (3) \$1.50 reserved section (students)—lower deck, sections 6, 7, 8, 9. Visitors' sections are sections 36 and 37.
- (4) \$1 general admission—lower deck, all sections except those shown in (3). (General admission not sold at Richman Brothers.)



FRIEND

CARROLL'S ATHLETIC DIRECTOR AND COACH

EUGENE G. "GENE" OBERST-Athletic Director-Notre Dame, '24, born in Owensboro, Ky., in 1901, one of 11 children . . . began football career at Notre Dame in 1919, playing with the immortal George Gipp . . . teamed with the Four Horsemen in 1922 and 1923 . . . in 1924 qualified for Olympic team and represented U.S. in javelin throw at Paris that summer . . . after leaving Notre Dame in 1924 coached at Roman Catholic High School in Philadelphia where he assisted in developing one of Notre Dame's greats, Tom Conley, who later came to Carroll as head grid coach . . . later career included successful tenures as coach at Washington and Lee, Canisius and DePaul . . . named Director of Athletics at Carroll in 1942 and during the war set up training program for Navy V-12 here. ... under Gene's direction, Carroll returned to gridiron in 1946 after four-year layoff and reentered basketball competition the same year ... added boxing, track, golf and tennis to the sports calendar . . . through his incentive some of the foremost colleges in country now bolster Carroll's schedules.



GENE OBERST Director of Athletics

HERBERT C. "HERB" EISELE - Head Coach-Dayton, '26, born in 1904 at McKeesport. Pa. . . . product of Cleveland's Cathedral Latin High School . . . played end beside Bill Belanich from 1919 to 1921 . . . entered Dayton U. in 1922 . . . earned All-American honorable mention in sophomore year . . . injured in junior year, but returned in senior year to take All-Ohio and All-Catholic honors . . . took pass in 1922 to break deadlock as Dayton defeated Carroll 20-13 . . . went 55 yards for TD in 1925 when Carroll fell before Dayton 17-0 . . . named on 1922, 1923 and 1925 Carroll All-Opponent elevens . . . in 1926 accepted first coaching post at St. Mary's High School in Sandusky . . . two years later accepted coaching post at Cathedral Latin . . . in 19 years that followed, Herb compiled brilliant scholastic record, his teams running up total of 131 wins, 33 losses and 18 ties ... unbeaten in 36 straight ... spring of 1947 brought Herb college coaching portfolio for first time - at Carroll . . . 1947 season, with six wins, three losses, best for Streaks since 1939 . . . last year Herb topped a successful season (7-1-2) with a Great Lakes Bowl title.

FRANK G. "BILL" BELANICH—Line Coach—Dayton, '27, Cleveland-born in 1903 . . . has been playing with or assisting Herb since early days as player at Cathedral Latin . . . husky "Bull," later called "Bill," entered Dayton in 1923 . . . went on to become one of Flyers' all-time great tackles . . . named on Carroll's All-Opponent teams of 1925 and 1926 . . . in latter year gained All-American honorable mention, All-Ohio and All-Catholic . . . turned to professional football after graduation in 1927, playing with Dayton Triangles for next three years . . . came to Carroll in 1947 to build the strong Streak forward walls.

DAN N. "DANNY" MORMILE — Backfield Coach-John Carroll, '38, born in 1915 in Bedford, O. . . . began his grid career at Cleveland Holy Name High School . . . a scholastic twosport man . . . entered Carroll in 1934 . . . won renown as one of Blue Streaks' all-time greats on gridiron and hardwood . . . captained cage team in 1938 . . . quarterbacked Carroll in 1935, 1936 and 1937 . . . returned to Holy Name after graduation as assistant to Joe Gavin, now head coach at Dayton, and in 1947 took over head coaching duties when Gavin joined college ranks . . . 1947 team snapped Latin's 36-game win streak . . . signed as Carroll backfield coach in spring of 1948 . . . begins his second season as Streak coach.

RICHARD D. "DICK" TUPTA — Freshman Coach — Notre Dame, '43, Cleveland-born in 1921 . . . began his athletic career during Eisele's coaching tenure at Cathedral Latin . . . played on Latin's city championship football team of 1938 . . . won three letters each in football and track . . . still holds Cleveland Senate record in 440-yard dash . . . entered Notre Dame . . . joined Eisele staff at Carroll in spring of 1948 . . . has good-looking crop of freshmen to groom for 1950 varsity.

RICHARD A. "DICK" ILIANO—Trainer—Baldwin-Wallace, '39, born at Cleveland in 1916... attended Collinwood High School, graduating in 1934... entered Baldwin-Wallace and was member of the Yellow Jacket squad of 1938, winning monogram... a Cleveland Athletic Club boxing champ... served three years with the army ordnance division... holds master's degree in body mechanics from Western Reserve University and is charter member of Ohio-Michigan-Indiana Trainers Association... continues study of body mechanics during summer months at the University of Chicago.



JOHN CARROLL UNIVERSITY



GRASSELLI TOWER

John Carroll University, located in one of Cleveland's newer residential suburbs, University Heights, occupies seven imposing buildings and fifty acres of campus. Gothic type in architecture, the structures are completely furnished with modern equipment and facilities. Two buildings are devoted entirely to science.

John Carroll began her educational work in 1886 when the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) established itself in Cleveland by opening St. Ignatius College on the city's West Side.

In 1890 the college was incorporated under the laws of Ohio and legally empowered to confer the usual degrees of arts and sciences.

In 1896 a meterological observatory came into existence under the noted seismologist, the Rev. Frederick L. Odenbach, S.J. Eight years later

the Carroll seismological observatory was established, thus becoming the fourth observatory of its kind to be founded in the United States. It now ranks among the top ten seismological stations in the country.

Late in December, 1935, after an intensive fund-raising campaign had achieved success for a building program, the university staff and students moved to their sparkling new quarters and plant in University Heights. Ten years later provision was made for a School of Business, Economics and Government to be added to the long-standing College of Arts and Sciences.

Expanding enrollment, enlargement of curricula and continued implementation of a wholesome educational philosophy have since further combined to give John Carroll University a permanently substantial reputation for sound advanced education.





Rodman Hall—The Carroll Placement Office here is located on the first floor and adjoins other offices of the school's Vocational Services division.

John Carroll University's Placement Service is designed to serve a two-fold purpose: first, to assist in the placement of recent graduates of the university and replacement of alumni; second, to cooperate with employers in search of qualified personnel for their staffs.

Headed by Placement Officer Michael J. Vaccaro, the department, in conjunction with the university Guidance Service, functions to help the Carroll student and graduate determine the most effective vocational outlet for his abilities and interests. The long-range educational and vocational planning, which is the prime consideration of the placement staff, assures the employer highly trained job candidates who have the ability and interest to competently carry out their work assignments.

Services available to employers include arranging on- and off-campus interviews, distributing application blanks, administering preferred batteries of tests, obtaining letters of recommendation and many others.

The Placement Service three years ago was little more than an office and an officer. Today its excellently trained staff and modern facilities indicate a growth which has not only kept pace with the university's over-all progress but which promises an even steadier advance in the future.



MARSHALL COLLEGE



"OLD MAIN" — ENTRANCE TO MARSHALL COLLEGE CAMPUS

Marshall College, an institution of higher education supported by the state of West Virginia, was founded in 1837 by citizens of Cabell County. Its purpose was to provide preparatory schooling for those entering college or planning a career of teaching in the common schools. John Laidley, a leader in the movement, was a friend and admirer of Chief Justice John Marshall for whom the school was named.

Although enrollment was satisfactory and academic progress was reported, financial support was lacking. When the Civil War broke out, the situation became acute. The school was sold for debts in 1861 and operated as a private school to satisfy a clause in the deed for the land on which the school was located.

On February 27, 1867, the Legislature passed an act calling for the establishment of a State Normal School to be called the West Virginia State Normal School at Marshall College. The Teachers College was organized and the first baccalaureate degrees were conferred in June, 1921.

The College of Arts and Sciences was established in June, 1923. In August, 1938, the Bachelor of Science degree was authorized, and in 1940, the degree in general engineering, Bachelor of Engineering Science, was established. In the spring of 1945, the Associate in Arts and Associate in Science degrees were approved in ten fields.

Graduate work in six departments was authorized in October, 1938. This division has been extended to several departments and confers the Master of Arts and Master of Science

degrees.
