## ASSOCIATE IN PROFESSIONAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

This ceremony marks the completion of the first class of the Associate in Professional Management program at John Carroll University. This program, conceived in conjunction with the American Association of Industrial Management, Cleveland Branch, derives from the belief that the strength of the nation's business depends, in large part, upon the continuous upgrading of managerial personnel to meet the needs of an expanding economy.

The program is especially designed for the personal development of managers—men who have had several years of management experience at a responsible level and have been nominated by their respective companies to participate in the program.

The curriculum covers the functional areas of marketing, finance, control, and personnel, the human areas of supervision, leadership, and communications, the social areas of economics, politics, and law. These, plus an emphasis on administration and organization, should lead to the formation of an active personal philosophy of management.

*We pray Thee, O almighty and eternal God, who through Jesus Christ hast revealed Thy glory to all nations, to preserve the works of Thy mercy; that Thy church, being spread through the whole world, may continue, with unchanging faith, in the confession of Thy name.*

*We pray Thee, O God of might, wisdom, and justice, through whom authority is rightly administered, laws are enacted, and judgment decreed, assist, with Thy Holy Spirit of counsel and fortitude, the President of these United States, that his administration may be conducted in righteousness, and be eminently useful to Thy people over whom he presides, by encouraging due respect for virtue and religion; by a faithful execution of the laws in justice and mercy; and by restraining vice and immorality. Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of the Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government; so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge, and may perpetuate to us the blessings of equal liberty.*

*We pray for his Excellency, the Governor of this State, for the members of the Assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare; that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.*

*We recommend likewise to Thy unbounded mercy all our brethren and fellow-citizens, throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge, and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union and in that peace which the world cannot give; and, after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.*
