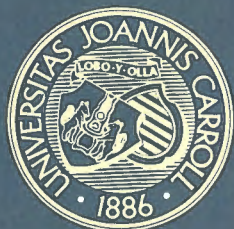

VINCENT DOWLING was born in Dublin, worked as an actor in the West End, and toured the British Isles as actor and director; came to the Abbey Theatre in the tradition of Yeats, Lady Gregory, and the expatriate J. M. Synge. Active in the Abbey from 1953 until he was named Deputy Artistic Director there in 1971; and then Artistic Director of the Peacock Theatre in 1972. He came to the United States and became Producing Director of the Great Lakes Shakespeare Festival in 1976; he moved the Festival to Playhouse Square in 1982.

His favorite plays include "Playboy of the Western World," "The Tempest," "Long Day's Journey Into Night," and the "Cherry Orchard." His productions in the GLSF have included classics and new works; he has been a constant creative presence in Cleveland for eight years. Now, as he moves to California and to his new position as Producing and Artistic Director of the Pacific Conservatory of the Performing Arts at Santa Maria, and the Santa Maria/Solvang Theaterfest in Central California, Cleveland will miss him very much.
