John Carroll University Commencement • May 29, 1988

The present Chapel of Saint Francis, which was dedicated by Bishop Anthony Pilla on December 10, 1987, stands on footings intended for the "Bishop's Chapel," on the new campus, in 1935. Cut limestone was ordered for that chapel. It was never completed, and the limestone was lost, destroyed, buried. During excavations for the recreation complex, two stones came to light. They represent Augustine of Hippo, Hildegarde of Bingen, Thomas Aquinas, Catherine of Siena, Ignatius of Loyola, and Pope Pius XI (the pope reigning when John Carroll's new campus was being prepared).

These six survived from the dreams and the stones of fifty years ago. They were learners and teachers; they were men and women; they were clerical, religious, and lay; they took learning seriously, and were familiar with God in prayer. From their new eminence in the atrium, may they survey and bless the comings and goings of their sons and daughters at John Carroll University, as they grace the program of this commencement.

#### THE ALUMNI MEDAL

The Alumni Medals are conferred annually as the highest award of the John Carroll University Alumni Association upon alumni and others who have, through the distinguished conduct of their lives, either brought extraordinary credit to the university or contributed conscientious service to the Alumni Association, or both. The recipients of the award this year are:

## Mr. Edward D. Dickson Class of 1973

"A most remarkable man," Mr. Stokes read into the Congressional Record about you in June of 1973 upon your graduation from John Carroll University. Our Congressman could not have been more correct in his assessment. You are a remarkable man and a remarkable alumnus. Your education here and your citizenship in Cleveland are a testimony and a tribute to the energy and endurance of thousands of American evening college graduates.

Beginning your undergraduate studies in 1947, you continued them on a part-time basis, when you could, for no less than 26 years. Early in that period you overcame the obstacles presented by a seriously ill spouse and a meager income. Later when you were more able, you did not neglect the extracurricular aspects of your education — you were the founding president of Alpha Sigma Lambda, our fraternity for part-time students. The award for special achievement that fraternity developed in 1967 under your leadership continues to be granted today.

Your career with the United States Postal Service is remarkable. For many years, you have been a leader, one of the most productive, in the university's Alumni in Admissions Program, and you are a member of our Minority Affairs Advisory Board. You have served as president and trustee of Calvary Presbyterian Church, in which you have been an active member for decades. You are a member of Omega Psi Phi, the national fraternity for Black university graduates.

You and your Lady Vivian are remarkable examples of the achievement of the American Dream: you worked so hard and so long to become educated; now you can point with pride to your daughter and her husband, both doctors of education.

Doctor of Laws Rev. T. P. O'Malley, S.J.

Presented by: Mr. James S. Reid, Jr. Chairman of the Board of Trustees He has been heard to exclaim, in good times and bad, the words of the 19th Century French preacher Lacordaire: "Quelle vie! What a life! And it is yours, oh priest of Jesus Christ!" And what a priest and father he has been to John Carroll University.

Born outside Boston, educated at Boston College, Fordham University, College St.-Albert de Louvain in Belgium, and the University of Nijmegen, The Netherlands, Thomas Patrick O'Malley's life intersected with John Carroll first in 1975 as Trustee, and since 1980 as President. He brought new vigor and a sense of urgency to a university completing its first century of service. This he did with his philosophy embracing the Jesuit tradition of intellectual inquiry; the conviction that prizes a liberal education as the best preparation for a lifetime of learning, and a profound appreciation for the complexities of 20th Century society and the world of work. As he departs this campus, he leaves behind a stronger institution as measured by faculty, students, facilities, finances, support by alumni and an uncompromising dedication to Jesuit ideals.

Fr. O'Malley will be remembered as an academician who enriched John Carroll. And he will be remembered for the man that he is — a man of voracious intellectual appetite. Robust humor and enormous *joie de vivre*; a man both Catholic and catholic in his devotion to life; a warm human being; an enthralling raconteur; and one of the few men alive who can effortlessly weave into a single sentence the words of Saint Ignatius, Julian of Norwich, and Ogden Nash. A sharp, direct, clear thinker, his love of precise language, beautiful music and liturgy has left its mark on John Carroll. Devout Jesuit, devoted president, wise administrator, tireless fund raiser, progressive educator and passionate theologian, he has served John Carroll well. "Quelle vie! What a life! #### Commencement Speaker for the Class of 1988

THE VERY REV. HOWARD J. GRAY. S.J., is a native of Cleveland, a graduate of St. Ignatius High School and, by reason of an honorary doctorate at the Centennial Commencement of 1986, an alumnus of John Carroll University. He has been Provincial of the Detroit Province of the Society of Jesus since 1983. The Provincial, while not a bishop, is rather like a bishop in his direction of the Jesuits in his area, which stretches from Michigan to Toledo to Northeastern Ohio. He was a long-time rector at Weston School of Theology, in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and a some-time dean there; he comes to his task as Provincial from a rich experience of spiritual direction, and from a deep knowledge of the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius. He has been ghostly father to a whole younger generation of Jesuits. He is a careful crafter of language, and has an ear attuned to contemporary language that comes from extraordinarily wide reading. He is very much sought after as a speaker, and his calendar is filled twenty months into the future. He has been a strong supporter of the Jesuit ideal in higher education, both at John Carroll University and at the University of Detroit; and of the Jesuit high schools in the Province, the University of Detroit High School, St. Ignatius High School, St. John's High School-Toledo, and Walsh Jesuit High School.

#### **Honorary Degrees**

MRS. SALLY KENNY GRISWOLD was born in Lakewood, Ohio, but moved very quickly to Cleveland Heights, where she grew up in a family of eight. Some of that close-knit family will be cheering her on today. She graduated from Cleveland Heights High School, the University of Michigan, and holds a master's degree from John Carroll University in guidance and counseling. She married Bruce Griswold in 1942. Since Bruce is active in the affairs of the Court of nisi prius, that august body, in its droll fashion, decreed the middle name "kinetic" to Sally, by reason of her community activities. The poetry of Edna St. Vincent Millay is a favorite with her, and especially lines from a poem "Renascence," which is the title poem of a Millay collection. Sally served two terms (eight years) on the Shaker Heights Board of Education. She is a past chairman of the Board of Trustees of John Carroll Univesity, has been a board member of The Federation for Community Planning, one of eleven members of the Distribution Committee of The Cleveland Foundation, and has a host of other community commitments. Bruce and Sally Griswold have four children: Janet, James, John, and Thomas, whose careers are in modeling, the law, the hotel (and now the real estate) industry, and finally, morning drive time broadcasting in Indianapolis, the "Bob and Tom Show," which Counselor Griswold, Sr., hopes is covered by the First Amendment. While on the Board at John Carroll, Sally Griswold was influential in creating the program, "Choices for Women." She is given to writing bits of poetry for family celebrations, when she has time, and when she is home.

THE REV. THOMAS P. O'MALLEY, S.J., entered the Society of Jesus, New England Province, in 1952, after graduation from Boston College and Fordham University. After novitiate and philosophy studies, he taught Latin and Greek, and coached debate, at the College of The Holy Cross, in Worcester, Massachusetts; he went to Louvain, Belgium, and the French-speaking Jesuit House of Studies in Eegenhoven. He was ordained in Brussels, in August, 1961; returned to the United States in 1962-63 for "tertianship," the last part of the Jesuit training; and then went to the University of Nijmegen, The Netherlands, for graduate studies in Early Christian Latin and Greek. Receiving a Doctor of Letters degree in October, 1967, he went to Boston College as chairperson of the Classics Department, and then of the Theology Department; became Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences in 1973. In 1980, he became the twentieth President of John Carroll University. He counts it as his very good luck to have had among his teachers, his parents Austin and Anne O'Malley, George and Jean Bemis, John Louis Bonn, S.J., Joseph Maguire, Rudolph Arbesman, Leopold Malevez, Camille Dumont, and Christine Mohrmann. In 1988-89, he will be a visiting professor in the Biblical Studies Department of the Catholic Institute of West Africa, Port Harcourt, Nigeria.
