## ***THE ASCENSION***

**From the Cathedral of St. Sophia, Novgorod, *ca.* 1500.  
Tretyakov Gallery**

Against a dark circle representing heaven, the ascended Christ is seated in a position of authority, welcomed and revered by two angels. Two other angels explain the matter to the eleven apostles and Matthias, who was chosen to be an apostle a few days later. The apostles will be sanctified by the Spirit at Pentecost and do not yet have halos. Mary with halo prays in the center. In the background are two trees and stylized mountains.

Icons feature prominently in the liturgy of the Eastern rites; an icon of The Ascension is appropriate here, with the Feast of the Ascension falling this year on the Thursday following Commencement. The President of the University is bi-ritual, celebrating the liturgy in the rite of the Byzantine Catholic Church as well as in the Latin rite; hence, his special interest in icons.

The second greatest commandment is "to love thy neighbor as thyself." Mike Conway has lived this commandment with his life and dedication to the Ameri-Asian children abandoned half way around the world. He has not only extended his friendship and love but has taken the time to instill in them a will to live and the confidence to take their place in society.

Mike Conway graduated from John Carroll University in 1964. His years at John Carroll went unnoticed by all except a few classmates who befriended him as one would a younger brother. A graduate of ROTC, Mike was commissioned in the United States Army and like many others of this era, he served in Vietnam. But unlike all the others he was moved by the plight of the Vietnamese and especially the "Cong My Lai," or the American half-caste children.

His desire to help extended beyond just taking care of their physical needs. He saw a need to prepare them to take their place in our society, a need to instill confidence into children who were without heritage or country, a need to force them to overcome their fears and draw from the inner courage he knew was there. His response to these needs was to develop his now famous Adventure Ropes Course, i.e., the Ban Tat System.

This adventure course demands little physical strength but imparts confidence, draws on the inner will, and teaches how to control fear. His course has been installed in camps in San Francisco and San Jose, California. In 1989, he traveled to the Philippines to establish his course in the refugee camps there. This year the U.S. State Department has asked Mike to establish his course in Thailand and Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Mike Conway continues to serve our society as a police officer in San Francisco. He is a loving husband to Mary, and the proud father of Katie, his daughter.

For his dedication to the needs of others, his service to the community, his inventiveness, and his recognition of each man as his neighbor, the Alumni Association of John Carroll University is proud to award the Alumni Medal to Michael Conway, Class of 1964.

James J. McDonough  
*Class of 1955*

"If someone asks for your shirt, give him your coat as well. And if someone asks you to carry his pack a mile, carry it two miles." The words of St. Matthew do well in describing the private life of Jim McDonough. If you had to write his biography in one word, it would have to be "generous." Generous with his time, generous with his talent, and generous with his treasure.

A former city of Chicago employee who rose to Commissioner of Streets and Sanitation, and Chairman of the Board of the Chicago Transit Authority under the late Mayor Daley, Jim left public service in 1974 to join Murphy Engineering, a firm he subsequently purchased and renamed McDonough Associates.



The City of Chicago was Jim's beginning and he has, and is, paying it back a hundredfold. He has served the Boy Scouts and the Red Cross and is currently serving on boards or as chairman of the following: The Chicago Association of Commerce and Industry; Kellogg Graduate School at Northwestern; Mercy Hospital; St. Xavier College; Chicago Convention and Visitors Bureau; and Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese.

Jim and Jackie have been happily married since 1961. Their daughter Maureen is a John Carroll graduate and Jim, Jr. received his degree from Marquette. Being a CEO of an international company and a leader in community affairs, his acquaintances read like a Who's Who, but he has always maintained a strong loyalty to his family and to a host of friends such as South Side neighbors, high school chums or JCU Alumni buddies.

He is extremely dedicated to the Jesuit education philosophy. One of the founders and co-chairmen of the "Christmas Benefit" that has raised millions of dollars, Jim is one of the "Duke's Men," a group that raised substantial dollars to name Millor Hall here after the friend and confidant. Jim currently is a member of the President's Council and an active committee member for his 35th reunion which takes place in two weeks.

Because of his generosity to his class, his church, and his community, the Alumni Association presents its Alumni Medal to James J. McDonough.

### Helen Weil *Class of 1943*

A daughter of Abraham, Helen Weil's life epitomizes the courage of Esther and the dedication of Ruth. A woman of faith and compassion, Helen has worked with the aged, the homeless, and the refugees for over 50 years.

With her two children, Mrs. Weil escaped from Nazi Germany in 1938, more than a year before the start of World War II and the Holocaust.

Helen joined her husband in New York, where she lived for two years raising her children and helping support an extended family of relatives. She worked during the day at the New York Refugee Relief Center and at night made zippers on consignment. Through all of this, she never lost her commitment to her faith or to her family.

Coming to Cleveland, she applied to John Carroll in 1941. While working and raising a family, she graduated in just two years at the age of 39. She received a degree in Sociology and wrote her JCU thesis on the topic of refugees from Germany. Helen added an advanced degree from Western Reserve University and plunged into a career as one of the first social workers in a retirement home.

She saw very early the needs of the aged who must live in an institution. She responded to these needs and, together with her husband, the director of the Montefiore Home in Cleveland Heights, established innovative programs for the aged. She has written over 90 articles for various professional journals and papers. In addition, she has presented 40 papers on the topic of Aging and the Care of the Aged. Many of her ideas for helping elderly residents live more active lives have become the basis of good health care standards for the aged all over the country.

A mother of two, she speaks of her husband, who died last April after 64 years of marriage, in reverent tones, heaping praise on his talents and his character. Her own career, she is quick to point out, was merely as helpmate. But her modesty is belied by the record of her life. In 1972, the Cuyahoga Senior Citizens Council named both Helen and her husband Senior Citizens of the Year. Six years later, Helen was voted a charter member of the Ohio Senior Citizens Hall of Fame, an honor shared with a dozen other luminaries such as Bob Hope, Louis B. Seltzer and Jesse Owens.

In recognition of her courage, tireless devotion to her family and faith, responsiveness to the needs of the community, and leadership in the health care field for the aged, the Alumni Association of John Carroll University is honored to present the Alumni Medal to Helen Weil of the Class of 1943.

## Biographies of the Commencement Speaker and Honorary Degree Recipients

LAWRENCE M. O'ROURKE, born in Philadelphia in 1938, received a B.A. from Villanova and a J.D. from Georgetown University Law School. He has also attended seminars at the John F. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, the Washington Journalism Center, the Horace Mann Learning Center and the U.S. Department of State. He began his journalism career at *The Philadelphia Bulletin* in 1955 and was chief of their Washington Bureau from 1970 to 1980. While working in the Department of Education during the Carter administration (1980-81), he served as the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Policy and Planning and the Acting Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs. In 1981 he worked as a writer, editor and consultant for the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. In 1981 he joined *The St. Louis Post-Dispatch* Washington Bureau and since 1984 has been the White House Correspondent. He still maintains a private practice of law and is a visiting Fellow for the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation. As a Wilson Fellow, he visited John Carroll in the spring of 1989. He is the recipient of numerous honors, among them the Missouri Press Association Special Award, the Raymond Clapper Prize for National Reporting — second place, National Headliners Award, Merriman-Smith Award for Washington Reporting under pressure, and Distinguished Alumnus Award from Villanova. He has served as President of the White House Correspondents' Association and The Gridiron Club. He edited *The American Teacher*, and contributed to *Between God and Caesar*, and is currently working on a biography of Monsignor Geno Baroni who worked for greater appreciation of ethnicity in American Society. An avid runner, he and his wife Pat live in Chevy Chase, Maryland, with their four children Christopher, Katherine, Jennifer, and Timothy.

LELAND SCHUBERT Ph.D., born in Toledo, Ohio in 1907, and a graduate of Ohio Wesleyan (1930), has a M.F.A. from Yale (1934) and a PhD from Cornell (1938). He taught drama at Ohio Wesleyan, Eastern Illinois State Teachers College, and Madison College (now James Madison University), eventually shifting to English. After serving in the United States Navy (1943-1945) he resumed teaching at Carleton College and chaired the English Department at Madison. He is the author of *Hawthorne the Artist*, *A Guide to Oral Communications*, and histories of the Schubert and Dwan families. He co-authored *Writing and Speaking*. A bibliophile, he owned and ran a book shop, gathered a collection of 1920's books, and since 1957 has been a member of the Rowfant Club at which he is a frequent speaker. He has done very extensive research on John Buchan. Meeting Helen Keller was one influence that led him to become a certified Braille transcriber and to braille more than 150 volumes for the blind. He has served on the boards of the Bratenahl schools, the Cleveland Play House, the Cleveland Society for the Blind, the Cleveland Branch of the English Speaking Union, the Fairmount Center for the Creative and Performing Arts, the Fairmount Theater of the Deaf, Friends of the Cleveland Public Library, Gilmour Academy, the Interracial High School Scholarship Fund, the Musical Arts Association (the Cleveland Orchestra), the National Catholic Conference for Interracial Justice, Ohio Wesleyan University, Project Bridge, and Woodruff Hospital.

HELEN DWAN SCHUBERT, born in M.A. Two Harbors, Minnesota in 1908, was graduated from the University of Minnesota in 1930 and earned her MA in American Literature from Cornell (1939). She studied piano at Yale and is a scholarly devotee of Gerard Manley Hopkins. She was Chairman of the Citizens Committee for the Schools of Harrisonburg, Virginia (1951), became very involved in the American Association of University Women and eventually served as its Virginia State President (1952). She founded the United Nations Committee of Northfield, Minnesota, whose Chamber of Commerce named her Woman of the Year in 1947. She has tutored children in Cleveland's inner-city Catholic schools, and has served on the boards of the Cleveland Music School Settlement, the Council for Community Improvement, Gilmour Academy, HELP for Retarded Children, the United Independent School of East Cleveland, Leadership Cleveland, and the St. Angela Foundation. Leland and Helen were married in 1931, and have three sons: John, Gage, and Leland W. Since coming to Cleveland in 1956, and before, their philanthropy and personal service have supported the causes of education, interracial justice and harmony, the disadvantaged and handicapped, the arts. They received the 1971 Benedict Rodman Award of JCU.
