

<u>Fr. Lavelle:</u> (Gives Greetings and Presents Speaker.)

<u>Dr. Baumgartner:</u> (Gives Commencement Address.)

Fr. Fennessy: Thank you, Dr. Baumgartner.

CONFERRING OF DEGREES

College of Arts and Sciences

Fr. Fennessy: Candidates from the College of Arts and Sciences for the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, please rise. Dr. Travis, Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, will present these candidates.

Dr. Travis: Reverend President, on behalf of the faculty of the College of Arts and Sciences, I certify that the candidates whose names are hereby submitted have satisfied all the requirements for the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, and respectfully recommend that these degrees be conferred upon them.

(Dr. Travis hands scroll to Fr. Lavelle.)

<u>Fr. Lavelle:</u> By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Board of Trustees of the University, I hereby confer on these candidates the degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, with all the rights, privileges, and obligations thereunto appertaining.

<u>Fr. Fennessy:</u> Graduates of the College of Arts and Sciences, please come forward.

(Each candidate hands his/her name card to the Dean and approaches the President as his/her name is read. After receiving the diploma, the graduate files back to his/her seat and remains standing.)

<u>Fr. Fennessy:</u> Graduates of the College of Arts and Sciences, please be seated.

(Each candidate hands his/her name card to the Dean and approaches the President as his/her name is read. After receiving the diploma, the graduate files back to his/her seat and remains standing.)

(Dr. Wertheim hands scroll to Fr. Lavelle.)

<u>Fr. Lavelle:</u> By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Board of Trustees of the University, I hereby confer on these candidates the degrees of Master of Arts, Master of Business Administration, Master of Education, and Master of Science, with all the rights, privileges, and obligations thereunto appertaining.

<u>Fr. Fennessy:</u> Graduates of the Graduate School, please come forward.

(Each candidate hands his/her name card to the Dean and approaches the President as his/her name is read. After receiving the diploma, the graduate files back to his/her seat and remains standing.)

<u>Dr. Wertheim:</u> (Standing at the podium.) The graduates will now robe themselves in their hood, the symbol of their graduate degree. (Dr. Wertheim gives the signal.)

CONCLUSION

<u>Fr. Fennessy:</u> Ladies and gentlemen, please rise for the benediction and remain standing for the "Alma Mater." The benediction will be given by Rev. Dr. Louis G. Pecek, Assistant Academic Vice President.

<u>Rev. Dr. Pecek:</u> (Reads the Benediction.)

Fr. Fennessy:

will now lead us in singing the "Alma Mater."

(The "Alma Mater" is sung.)

Fr. Fennessy: Please remain standing.

This concludes the formal portion of the Commencement exercises. I remind you that all are welcome to the reception on the Nathan Dauby Plaza immediately following the recessional.

I ask all graduates, parents, and guests to remain at their places until the faculty have recessed.

On behalf of the University, thank you for sharing these ceremonies with us this evening.

(Fr. Fennessy gives signal for recessional.)

SUDDEN RAIN ALTERNATIVE

(If Fr. Lavelle decides to end the ceremonies because of sudden severe rain, he will immediately step up to a microphone and say:)

<u>Fr. Lavelle:</u> Because of the present severe weather conditions, these commencement exercises will be concluded <u>in forma brevi</u>.

(If only the Graduate School candidate scroll needs to be presented, Dr. Wertheim immediately presents the candidates and Fr. Lavelle confers the degrees using the usual formula - page 5.)

(If two or three scrolls remain, Fr. Schlegel takes them from the other deans and says:)

<u>Fr. Schlegel:</u> Reverend President, on behalf of the faculty of the University, I certify that the candidates whose names are hereby submitted have satisfied all the requirements for their appropriate degrees and respectfully recommend that these degrees be conferred upon them.

<u>Fr. Lavelle:</u> By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Board of Trustees of the University, I hereby confer on these candidates the degrees for which they have been recommended, with all the rights, privileges, and obligations thereunto appertaining.

(If no degrees in course need to be conferred, or after they are conferred in the above fashion:)

<u>Fr. Fennessy:</u> You are all invited to retire immediately to the lobby ouside Kulas Auditorium for refreshments; diplomas will be available in the front of Kulas Auditorium. These proceedings are ended.

(All depart without ceremony.)
