

#### THE HOLY TRINITY

by Andrei Rublev, early 15th century. Tretyakov Gallery, Moscow

Andrei Rublev, honored as a saint in the Eastern Church, has in this masterpiece of Russian and world art portrayed the Trinity with utmost economy, his symbolism based on the visit of three angels to Abraham and Sarah at the oak of Mamre (Gen. 18:1). Their intent is redemptive: a sacrificial offering on the table, or rather altar, prefigures the Lamb of God slain for our salvation; the oak tree behind the Christ figure symbolizes his cross. The colors of their cloaks distinguish them as three, the Father to our left. The circular composition, their common transparent beauty, the blue of their garments, their accord, harmony, sympathy and peace manifest the unity of their eternal nature. Here is the Russian people's dream, then as well as now, of civil harmony and peace. The icon invites us to pray before it and to be drawn into the peace and unity of Trinitarian life. The recess in the front of the altar invites us perhaps to enter into the sacrifice as well. A copy of this icon adorns the entrance to Bruening Hall in our School of Business.

Icons feature prominently in the liturgy of the Eastern rites. The president of the University is bi-ritual, celebrating the liturgy in the rite of the Byzantine Catholic Church as well as in the Latin rite; hence, his special interest in icons.

#### AMERICAN VALUES AWARD

In His Sermon on the Mount, Jesus said to His disciples, "You are the salt of the earth, you are the light of the world, a city set on a hill cannot be hidden." He then bade His disciples to continue to be a good flavor for this world. He enjoined them to enlighten a world that threatens constantly to go dark.

Jesus today has made the same request of us, His disciples. He has spoken especially to Jack and Rhodora Donahue asking them to be the "salt of the earth, and the light of the world." They have responded by being both flavorers and enlighteners. They have given people the taste of traditional values in cultivating strong family life. They have been light to other families and have exemplified the beatitudes as they extend help to those in need. As St. Peter said in his first Epistle, "As generous distributors of God's manifold grace, you have put your gifts at the service of one another and to all, each in the measure that you have received."
