

THE TRANSFIGURATION

by Theophanes Bathas, a monk from Crete. Monastery of the Great Lavra, Mount Athos, 1535.

This icon, based on the story of the Transfiguration (Mk 9:2-8) is one of a set of twelve icons that depict the major feasts of the church year.

Christ stands on a stylized Mount Tabor, his right hand raised in blessing, his clothing brilliant with glory. Behind him the oval mandorla represents the realm of the divine, the three angled shape marks the event as Trinitarian. Moses on his left and Elijah to his right represent the Law and the Prophets; they speak with him about his suffering, a fulfillment of the Scriptures. Moses would normally hold the book of the Law, but here he does not; Bathas thus emphasizes that Jesus with his scroll has replaced Moses as lawgiver and teacher. A ray of light falls upon each of the three disciples. Peter, bearded, speaks with the Lord. John (in the center) and James, overwhelmed by the rays of light, cover their faces and turn away. Their positions, adopted after a fourteenth century controversy, proclaim that the light of Tabor is divine and uncreated.

Icons feature prominently in the liturgy of the Eastern rites. The president of the University is bi-ritual, celebrating the liturgy in the rite of the Byzantine Catholic Church as well as in the Latin rite; hence, his special appreciation of icons.

The Alumni Medals are conferred annually as the highest award of the John Carroll University Alumni Association upon alumni and others who have, through the distinguished conduct of their lives, either brought extraordinary credit to the university or contributed conscientious service to the Alumni Association, or both. The recipients of the award this year are:

John R. Cunin Class of 1950

John R. Cunin is his brother's keeper. He has used his time and talent to supply light for those in darkness and refuge for the poor. A man of deep convictions, strong leadership skills and genuine humility, he has long been an advocate of Jesuit education and social justice.

No stranger to hardship or the possibility of death, from 1942 to 1945 John flew 30 missions as a gunner in the 8th Air Force. He returned here to attend John Carroll for three years, only to be forced to quit in his senior year for lack of funds.

The list of John's key leadership roles is lengthy and includes: chairman of the Eva L. and Joseph M. Bruening Foundation; honorary chairman and director of Midtown Corridor; director of Cleanland Cleveland; past member of the board of directors for Society National Bank; past board member of Cleveland Tomorrow; and past chairman, chief executive officer and member of the board of Bearings, Inc. Under his 10 year leadership at Bearings, the company's revenues increased from \$300 million to \$680 million.

A living example of the Jesuit ideal of service to others, John is making a difference in the Cleveland community. He is a member of the board of Notre Dame College, John Carroll University, the Cleveland Catholic Diocese Inner City School Program, Our Lady of the Wayside Advisory Board, St. Vincent Charity Hospital and Health Center, and board member and past chairman of Vocational Guidance Services. In addition, he worked with Father Bob Begin of the West Side Ecumenical Ministry to form an advisory board of community leaders to more effectively help the poor of that area.

John and his wife, Marilyn, parents of five, will celebrate their 41st anniversary in August.

In recognition of his leadership in business, his life-long support of education in the Cleveland community, his service to John Carroll University, and his dedication to the service of others, the Alumni Association of John Carroll University is proud to award John R. Cunin '50 its highest award, the Alumni Medal for 1993.

Ralph "Pete" French Class of 1934

An attorney for more than 54 years, Ralph "Pete" French has been an outstanding example of Jesuit education and Christian ethics. A devoted family man and practicing Catholic, Pete has been a loyal supporter, volunteer and ambassador for John Carroll University for well over a half-century.

His support of the Diocese of Cleveland and the larger Catholic community has been of similarly long standing. He is a long-time member of the Knights of Columbus, a past president of the Diocesan Retreat League and an honorary life trustee of Catholic Charities. In addition, he serves as an acolyte at the diocese's flagship church, St. John's Cathedral. He has been active in the St. Vincent DePaul Society for 40 years, and was national vice president, regional chairman and president of its Cleveland Particular Council.

Pete's service to John Carroll began when he graduated in 1934, and continues to this day. He has served as a trustee on the University's Alumni Association Board of Trustees, and presently is the *Alumni Journal* columnist for all of the graduating classes prior to 1935. A tireless supporter of collegiate athletics, despite the pacemaker recently implanted in his chest, he is believed to be the only person in John Carroll's history to have been awarded a varsity letter for serving as a team manager.

A father of five and grandfather of 16, Mr. French practiced general civil law for many years with his late brother Christopher. His three sons — all graduates of John Carroll — have followed in his professional footsteps: Two are attorneys (including his son Jim, who now shares a practice with him) and another is employed in the judicial system.

For his outstanding efforts in support of the community, his professional dedication, and his generous life-long support of John Carroll University, the Alumni Association is proud to award Ralph "Pete" French its highest award, the Alumni Medal for 1993.

Jack and Betty Hissong Class of 1952

Biographies of the Commencement Speaker and Honorary Degree Recipients

DR. BERNADINE P. HEALY graduated summa cum laude from Vassar College in 1965 and cum laude from Harvard Medical School in 1970. After postgraduate work at The Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, she joined its faculty in 1976, became Professor of Medicine, and served also as Director of the Coronary Care Unit and Assistant Dean for Post Doctoral Programs and Faculty Development.

In 1984 she became Deputy Director of the Office of Science and Technology Policy at the White House. She was Chairman of the White House Cabinet Working Group on Biotechnology, Executive Secretary of the White House Science Council's Panel on the Health of Universities, and member of many advisory boards.

From 1985 to 1991 she was Chairman of the Research Institute of The Cleveland Clinic Foundation, where she directed the research of nine departments and served as a staff member in the department of cardiology.

In 1991 Dr. Healy became Director of the National Institutes of Health (NIH), which supports the work of 4000 scientists at its Bethesda, Maryland campus and is the major funder of biomedical research nationwide. She launched the NIH Women's Health Initiative and began formulating NIH's first Strategic Plan, which will guide it into the 21st century.

Among her numerous professional affiliations she has been president of the American Federation of Clinical Research and of the American Heart Association. Dr. Healy has written extensively in the areas of cardiovascular research and medicine, and has served on the editorial boards of numerous scientific journals. She is married to Dr. Floyd Loop, and has two daughters.

REV. MARINO FRASCATI, O.de.M., born in Castelviscardo, Italy, studied with the Mercedarians and entered their order at Collegio San Raimondo in Nemi. He studied philosophy with the Jesuits at the Gregorian University, Rome and theology with the Franciscans at St. Joseph's in Teutopolis, Illinois, where he was ordained in 1951.

His work in Italy convinced him of the importance of bringing the values of Catholic social teaching into the realm of public policy and action. After assignments at Our Lady of Mercy in Middleburg Heights and St. Rocco's Church in Cleveland, he came to Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church on the West Side in 1957 where he has been Pastor since 1970.

He has been chaplain to convents and men's groups; a member of the West Side Ecumenical Ministry, the West 65th Street Cluster, the Priests' Senate, on the boards of St. Augustine's Manor, the West Side Catholic Center, and advisory boards for the bishop, mayor and governor; a founder of the Villa Mercede Community Development Organization and the Nolasco Housing Corporation; a cofounder and long time president of the Detroit Shoreway Community Development Organization.

He fosters cooperation with other churches and civic groups for the common good, works to provide housing for the elderly, low income families, the handicapped and others, and strives to endow education and to make his parish a catalyst for a better neighborhood and society. He is active in many Italo-American organizations and was named Cavaliere dell'Ordine al Merito of the Republic of Italy.

THE TRADITION OF THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

One of the more striking aspects of academic ceremonies is the colorful dress of the participants. An understanding of the traditions determining style and color of costumes can enrich one's attendance at such events.

The distinctive academic dress has its origin in the universities of the middle ages where cold buildings and tonsured heads made warm gowns and protective hoods a matter of necessity. Individual institutions such as Cambridge and Oxford adopted special rules governing the kind of dress that was to be permitted, and the custom was repeated throughout Europe. It is for this reason that some of the most eye-catching gowns are those mandated by European schools.

In America, practice has been somewhat less venturesome. Although the custom of wearing distinctive attire had existed since the time of the colonial colleges, present usage seems to date from a conference held at Columbia in 1895. From that meeting came a resolution calling for the regulation by code of what was generally to be worn at academic events. That code, revised in 1932 and again in 1960, makes recommendations as to the pattern, material, color and trimmings to be used on academic gowns.

The bachelor's gown, with long pointed sleeves, is worn closed. The master's gowns, which can be worn open, have a distinct oblong sleeve with an arc cut in the front. Doctors wear the bell shaped sleeved robes which are marked with velvet facing in front and velvet bars on the sleeve. Although these gowns are all ordinarily black, in recent years there have been exceptions made in color.

Hoods for the various degrees differ in length. Bachelors wear three foot hoods; Masters, three and a half; and Doctors, four feet. They are bound by velvet or velveteen in colors which designate the wearer's area of specialization, and they are lined with the colors of the institution granting the degree. At John Carroll, the lining is blue and gold. Many institutions, however, have dispensed entirely with the bachelors' hoods.

The colors associated with the more common academic disciplines are: white for Arts and Letters; drab for Business; light blue for Education; purple for Law; dark blue for Philosophy; golden vellow for Science; and scarlet for Theology.

The cap traditionally worn is the black mortar board, although the tam and the Elizabethan will be seen on some of the faculty. The tassel is most often black. Doctors frequently wear gold, and lawyers wear purple.
