

THE ARCHANGEL MICHAEL

From the time when Fr. Michael Lavelle, S.J. assumed office as president of John Carroll University, we have adorned our baccalaureate and commencement programs with icons, sacred images used in worship in the eastern churches. We have done that because Fr. Lavelle was bi-ritual, celebrating the liturgy in the rite of the Byzantine Catholic Church as well as in the Latin rite. Now as a tribute to our late president, we choose the icon of his patron, St. Michael the Archangel.

St. Michael is called in Scripture the great prince and guardian of Israel. He is seen as the angel protector of God's people, their comfort and strength in time of trouble, the great warrior of God, fighting demonic forces and the power of evil.

The painter of this icon is Andrei Rublev, one of the great Russian masters, so revered by the Eastern Church for his union of art and spirituality that they have made him a canonized saint. The supple and fluid treatment of posture and gesture, the balance and lightness of colors, the echoing lines and curves of this composition, the charm and gentleness so unlike other Byzantine painting bear witness to Rublev's innovative genius.

Alumni Medals, the highest award of the John Carroll University Alumni Association, are presented annually to alumni and others who have, through the distinguished conduct of their lives, either brought extraordinary credit to the university or contributed conscientious service to the Alumni Association, or both. The recipients of the award this year are:

Thomas M. Tully Class of 1959

Thomas M. Tully is an outstanding example of a John Carroll alumnus who has combined professional achievement, civic consciousness and loyalty to his university.

A graduate of the Class of 1959, Tom earned a Juris Doctorate degree from DePaul University. His career of more than three decades has been divided almost equally between public service and private practice.

He has been a partner in the Chicago law firm of Tully and Weinstein since 1978. Prior to that he worked in the Criminal Division of the Illinois State Attorney's Office and in the Office of the Assessor of Cook County, where he won election to a four-year term as assessor of one of the nation's largest counties and earned a presidential citation for his work.

Throughout his career Tom has also demonstrated a strong sense of community involvement, serving on several boards of directors, notably that of Maryville Academy, a school for children from dysfunctional homes. Recognition of his volunteer work and generosity has ranged from the Twelve Tribes of Israel Award, presented by the Government of Israel, to the Catholic Man of the Year Award, presented by the Catholic Lawyers Guild of Chicago.

Tom Tully has demonstrated his allegiance to John Carroll in a number of ways. He served as chairman for the Chicago reception which welcomed Reverend Michael J. Lavelle, S.J. to the university's presidency. He has been an active participant in the Alumni-in-Admission program, and is a member of the President's Forum.

To his many honors, the Alumni Association is proud to add our highest award, the Alumni Medal, presented to Thomas M. Tully, of the Class of 1959.

Rev. Joseph O. Schell, S.J. Honorary Alumnus

Of the many professors and administrators who have formed the character of John Carroll University, few have been so warmly regarded as Reverend Joseph O. Schell, S.J. For many men and women, he claims the honor as their favorite teacher, their favorite Jesuit priest, their favorite John Carroll memory.

Father Schell entered the Society of Jesus following graduation from Lakewood High School in 1931. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Greek from Loyola of Chicago, earned advanced degrees in philosophy, theology, and Greek, and was ordained in 1944.

One year later he came to John Carroll as an instructor in philosophy. He became head of the department, head-master of the residence halls, dean of the College of Arts and Sciences and, in 1967, the university's 18th president. Father Schell's leadership, his sense of humor, and his immense personal effort helped guide the university through a period of great change, both external and internal. During his presidency, John Carroll became a coeducational institution and modernized its form of governance, granting authority to a predominantly lay board of trustees.

However, Father Schell had yet to make perhaps his greatest contribution to John Carroll University. In 1971, he founded Campus Ministry, through which students can practice service to God and service to others, principles that dwell at the very heart of Jesuit education.

For his enduring example, his unfailing kindness and fairness, and his half century of service to John Carroll University, the Alumni Association is honored to present its highest award, the Alumni Medal, to Father Joseph O. Schell.

James C. Boland Class of 1962

James C. Boland has become one of the pre-eminent public accounting executives in the nation. As vice chairman and regional managing partner for Ernst & Young, he oversees 19 offices in nine states and the District of Columbia. He has headed the audit division as well as the human resources group, has been responsible for multi-location and multi-national clients, and has served many privately-owned businesses and partnerships.

At John Carroll, Jim Boland was an outstanding student-athlete, starting on the basketball team and graduating from the School of Business. While on active duty as a U. S. Army First Lieutenant he earned a Master of Arts degree from George Washington University and later completed the Harvard Business School Advanced Management Program and the Indiana University Executive Program.

He has given his talents to many civic organizations including the Greater Cleveland Council of Boy Scouts, United Way Services and the Cleveland Health and Education Museum.

Jim Boland has used his many contacts to advance the cause of John Carroll and has supported the university in countless ways. He has served on the advisory board of the School of Business, on the public policy council, on the capital campaign committee, in the alumni mentoring program and in the class agent program. And he has established a Women in Business Scholarship in memory of his wife, Pat, who died of cancer in 1991.

For his unparalled professionalism, tireless volunteerism and effective advocacy on behalf of John Carroll University, the Alumni Association presents our highest award, the Alumni Medal, to James C. Boland.

Gerald P. O'Malley Class of 1962

Gerald P. O'Malley's love for John Carroll University is revealed in the active involvement he has maintained in alumni activities for nearly a quarter of a century. A demonstration of his enduring presence is being known as "Cuz" to not one, but two, John Carroll presidents, both Rev. Thomas P. O'Malley, S.J. and Rev. Michael J. Lavelle, S.J.

Jerry O'Malley has demonstrated the same degree of constancy in his professional and personal lives. As vice president of Dawson Financial Services, he has worked on employee benefits programs with large and small companies throughout the United States for three decades. He also has been a member of Holy Cross Parish in Euclid for more than 30 years.

Among his many roles on behalf of John Carroll, Jerry has been a charter member of the Alumni Club of Cleveland and a key organizer of the club's reverse raffle (at 17 years and counting, the longest running alumni activity). He has served as class agent and head agent, decade chairman of the 1960's classes, chairman of two record-setting reunion class gifts, chairman of the athletic committee that organized the Blue-Gold Club, a member of the Hall of Fame nominating committee, and a member of the Alumni Fund leadership gift committee.

Biographies of the Commencement Speaker and Honorary Degree Recipients

WAYNE EMBRY concluded his highly successful National Basketball Association career with the Milwaukee Bucks in 1968, playing for one season before retiring as a player. He became Boston's director of recreation, but returned to the Bucks in 1971 as vice president and general manager. Mr. Embry was subsequently a member of the board of directors and served as consultant to, and vice president of the Indiana Pacers. He was also president of the Michael Alan Lewis Company, which converts and fabricates fiberboard paper, insulation, and poly products for the automotive industry. In 1986, he became executive vice president and general manager of the Cleveland Cavaliers, in which capacity he directs the daily operations of the franchise. He is currently a member of the board of trustees of John Carroll University, the Greater Cleveland Roundtable, Greater Cleveland Growth Association, New Cleveland Campaign, Cleveland Scholarship Program, M.A. Hanna Company, Society National Bank, Ohio Casualty Insurance, Centerior Energy Corporation, the Basketball Hall of Fame, Daniel Webster College, Miami University, and the National Urban League. He is active with Special Olympics, and is a member of the USA Basketball Games Committee, a select group of coaches and basketball experts responsible for selecting the USA Olympic Team. Mr. Embry holds a Bachelor of Science in Education degree from Miami University, and is a member of the Miami University Hall of Fame. He and his wife, Terri — parents of Debbie, Jill and Wayne, Jr. — reside in Moreland Hills.

Francis Joseph Callahan graduated from the University of Dayton and the United States Naval Academy, and entered submarine school in New London, Connecticut, graduating in 1945. In 1947, he was selected by the Navy to attend MIT, graduating with a Bachelor of Science in Electrical Engineering (naval electronics) and, later, with a Master of Science in Nuclear Engineering. He served on several submarines before joining Admiral Rickover's staff, where he was project officer for the first two nuclear submarines, the Nautilus and the Seawolf. He retired from regular naval duty in 1958, staying on in the U.S. Naval Reserve until 1983. Mr. Callahan was hired to run Kenmore Research Company in Framingham, Massachusetts, then became executive vice president of Crawford Fitting Company. He holds over 15 patents on products he designed. He was promoted to president of the Swagelok Companies (which include Crawford Fitting Co., Nupro Co., Whitey Co., and Cajon Co.) in 1975, and still holds that position. Under his capable leadership, the company has grown from 150 to over 2,000 employees. Mr. Callahan was married to Mary Elizabeth Krouse (deceased), and is the father of three children — Francis J. Callahan III, Cornelia S. Callahan Richards and Timothy J. Callahan.

SISTER GRACE MARY CORBETT, S.N.D. received her Bachelor of Science in Education degree from St. John College, and her Master of Arts degree from John Carroll University. She taught at various elementary schools in the Greater Cleveland area as well as in Virginia, and currently teaches science, religion, reading and art at Notre Dame Elementary School in Chardon. She is also on Notre Dame's Environmental Curriculum Committee. She is a licensed social worker and holds professional certification as an elementary teacher and principal.

SISTER MARY VIRGINIA REESING, S.N.D. received her undergraduate degree from Notre Dame College, her Bachelor of Science in Education degree from St. John College, and her Master of Education degree from John Carroll University. She has also done advanced study at Notre Dame University and St. Mary's (Omaha). She has taught at, and served as principal of many Cleveland area schools. She is currently director of public relations for both Metro Catholic Parish School and the Sisters of Notre Dame. She has worked with parents on such issues as literacy, parenting, single parenting, leadership education and training, and has acted as GED liaison. Among her other skills are grant writing. She was a member of the Diocesan Core Committee for School Merger, and is past member of the Diocesan Principal Board as well as the Notre Dame Communication Committee.

SISTER ANN MARIE WINCHESTER, S.N.D. received her Bachelor of Arts in Special Education and High School English and her elementary education certification from Notre Dame College of Ohio, and her Master of Educational Administration from Xavier University (Cincinnati). She holds State of Ohio Elementary certificates for administration, special education of educable mentally retarded, and high school English, as well as a State of Ohio Elementary 8 Year Professional Certificate, a State of Ohio Non Tax Certificate, and a Master Professional Religious Education Certificate. She has taught at Julie Billiart School, St. Joan of Arc School, Holy Trinity School (Avon), St. Michael School, St. Joseph School, and Metro Catholic Parish School. She has also held administrative positions at Metro Catholic Parish School, which she helped to found, and Notre Dame Skills Lab. She is currently a computer consultant for Basic Computer Learning, where she teaches computer workshops, previews and evaluates software, and advises schools in technology planning, purchase and use of hardware and software.

THE TRADITION OF THE ACADEMIC COSTUME

One of the more striking aspects of academic ceremonies is the colorful dress of the participants. An understanding of the traditions determining style and color of costumes can enrich one's attendance at such events.

The distinctive academic dress has its origin in the universities of the middle ages where cold buildings and tonsured heads made warm gowns and protective hoods a matter of necessity. Individual institutions such as Cambridge and Oxford adopted special rules governing the kind of dress that was to be permitted, and the custom was repeated throughout Europe. It is for this reason that some of the most eye-catching gowns are those mandated by European schools.

In America, practice has been somewhat less venturesome. Although the custom of wearing distinctive attire had existed since the time of the colonial colleges, present usage seems to date from a conference held at Columbia in 1895. From that meeting came a resolution calling for the regulation by code of what was generally to be worn at academic events. That code, revised in 1932 and again in 1960, makes recommendations as to the pattern, material, color and trimmings to be used on academic gowns.

The bachelor's gown, with long pointed sleeves, is worn closed. The master's gowns, which can be worn open, have a distinct oblong sleeve with an arc cut in the front. Doctors wear the bell shaped sleeved robes which are marked with velvet facing in front and velvet bars on the sleeve. Although these gowns are all ordinarily black, in recent years there have been exceptions made in color.

Hoods for the various degrees differ in length. Bachelors wear three foot hoods; Masters, three and a half; and Doctors, four feet. They are bound by velvet or velveteen in colors which designate the wearer's area of specialization, and they are lined with the colors of the institution granting the degree. At John Carroll, the lining is blue and gold. Many institutions, however, have dispensed entirely with the bachelors' hoods.

The colors associated with the more common academic disciplines are: white for Arts and Letters; drab for Business; light blue for Education; purple for Law; dark blue for Philosophy; golden yellow for Science; and scarlet for Theology.

The cap traditionally worn is the black mortar board, although the tam and the Elizabethan will be seen on some of the faculty. The tassel is most often black, Doctors frequently wear gold, and lawyers wear purple.
