Fall Enrollment JCU's Greatest

1,800 To Attend In Both Day and Night Sessions

When classes start this autumn, John Carroll will be jammed with students—1,800 in all—the largest enrollment in the University's history. Of this total, 1,200 will attend day session classes and 600 will go to night classes, the Registrar's office informed the Carroll News.

Twelve hundred are already listed for the day session by the Registrar and although 100 vacancies are being held open, registration is closed. The 100 vacancies will be filled by former students most of whom will re-enter Carroll following service in the Army and Navy. If, however, all the vacancies are not filled by ex-students, new students will round out the figure of 1,200.

At least 600 will attend night classes which will be held four nights weekly—Monday through Thursday. Veterans who take 12 hours in night school will be eligible for total subsistence and may compete in inter-collegiate sports. Night classes will be co-ed.

Freshman week starts September 23 and the first year students and sophomores will register for classes September 25. Registration for juniors, seniors and night school students will be September 26. Classes for all will begin September 30.

The Registrar's office also said that 740 are attending the two summer sessions.

With an influx of 200 new students for the summer session which began June 21, John Carroll University's enrollment maintained its steady climb toward the one thousand mark. Of the 200 latest arrivals, 74 have never before tested college lore.

Prewar Carroll summer spells usually engaged six weeks and induced on the average of 200 students to attend. This season two sessions, consuming 10 weeks in all, are planned particularly to facilitate the veteran and keep his education running smoothly but swiftly. The first span already underway will draw to a halt on July 27, after which the second commences operation, utilizing

Mittinger Returns As University Registrar

Herbert A. Petit has resigned from his position as registrar and is now giving full time to teaching English. The present registrar, Eugene R. Mittinger, is well known at Carroll. He held the same post from 1938 to May, 1943, and was besides very active in school affairs. Before that time he had been an assistant professor in Mathematics, besides having charge

of publicity. For five years he was moderator of the Carroll News, and has also been on the athletic board. Mr. Mittinger was also City Treasurer in University Heights from 1934 to 1941, and last fall he was a candidate for the city council.

When he left here in 1943 he went into industry and became manager of the cost department of Ohio Foundry, a job he held for three years. The university was fortunate this summer when Mr. Mittinger was persuaded to return, first as adviser in the Veterans Guidance Center, and now as Registrar. His position is a most difficult one, due to the tremendous expansion in enrollment, but there is no question as to his ability to handle it.

Carroll News Changes Format Next Semester

A magazine since early in 1943, the Carroll News is to return to its original dress when the 1946-47 school year begins this fall. Returned vets will remember the campus publication prior to 1943 as a six column newspaper. The News will

also switch back to bi-weekly publication.

The News became a magazine under the editorship of John Elliott, '44, and was published monthly. Articles were condensed and news of Carrollites in service was stressed as thousands of mags were mailed each month to Carroll men in the armed forces.

This issue of the magazine, delayed due to final examinations, will mark the end of the glossy-cover days of the Carroll News. There is a possibility, however, that the magazine will be revived as an alumni organ. Converted into a magazine with the stress on news for Carroll men in the services, this, the final issue in the mag format, will contain an honor roll of those Carroll students who served and still are serving in the Army, Navy or its components.

60 Co-eds Take Summer Session Classes at JCU

Sixty co-eds enrolled in summer session courses here at Carroll and are now attending classes. Most of the girls are at the University "accelerating" in an effort to finish their studies a bit ahead of schedule. Others are taking subjects they were unable to fit into schedules at their "home" colleges, or are just snagging extra credit.

Of ten co-eds interviewed, six are students at Ursuline College during the regular school year, two will return to Notre Dame College in September, one will graduate from St. Teresa College in Winona, Minn., after the first summer session and one will go back to St. Marys of the Woods (Ind.) College.

Pat Little, 21-year-old brunette, will enter her final semester of schooling at Ursuline in September. Here at Carroll she is taking two subjects—Logic and History. Along with Miss Little, Betty Thompson of Notre Dame College was interviewed. Betty, who is blonde and 20, is also taking Logic and History and will be a senior at NDC this autumn. She would like to see Carroll co-ed all year 'round.

Pat McDonald of Ft. Wayne, Ind., is taking only the first half of Ethics after which she will return to Winona to graduate from St. Teresa College. Pat, who has taken on a couple of husky male students in golf (and beat 'em), needs only the Ethics credit for her diploma. Joan Slanina, another out-of-towner from Lorain, is taking Ethics and Victorian Poetry. Her alma mater is St. Marys of the Woods.

Bunny Vasil, formerly of Heights High and more currently of Ursuline,

takes one History course and then dashes down to Higbee's in time to run an elevator. Genevieve Curran is taking Spanish and Algebra. Marjorie Wise also takes Spanish along with Victorian Poetry. Eileen Walton is exposing herself to Poetry, too. Mary Agnes Gill of Willoughby spends her campus time in the Physics department. Misses Curran, Wise, Walton and Gill all matriculate at Ursuline.

Mary Kay Collins, brunette, 19, and a sophomore from Notre Dame, is the only girl in the German class she attends.

Since this is to be the last issue of the NEWS until fall, we'll take a slight review of the sport program during the past school year. The year was important for one reason—it marked the return of Carroll to inter-collegiate athletic competition. The Streaks were represented by a basketball team for the first time in three years. The student enrollment had dropped to 193 students and Coach Oberst just managed to put a team on the floor. The record of this quintet wasn't very impressive but a win over Case was one of the brightest spots of the season. Mr. Oberst couldn't use any of the 450 new students who enrolled in March. The newcomers were loaded with talent and, as a result, we probably had the strongest intramural league in the history of JCU. The two teams that played in the finals were loaded with former Carroll stars and it was a sad Gene Oberst who couldn't use them in the final game of the year against Reserve. Intramural sports again held the spotlight in spring sports, but football appeared and crowded it out as the Blue Streaks held their first spring practice since 1942. A golf team was organized and local rivals were again met on the golf links. Thus ended the first step toward former athletic standards.

Coming Events

With the start of the fall term, things will begin to jump again. A tough eight game schedule and a big, rough football squad will combine to satisfy the appetites of football-starved Carroll followers. The outlook is bright with more and more former gridiron-greats returning every day and it should be a great season.

The basketball team will take up the burden in December and here, too, things are looking up. Some of the games will be played in the Arena and new and larger opponents will be met. If all reports are true the Streaks will average well over six foot four and height is an important factor in big-time basketball. The Arena set-up sounds good and should pep up the interest of Cleveland's sporting fans in collegiate sports. Golf, tennis and possibly track will help to round out the sports schedule. All in all, it should be quite a year . . . See you around come September.

Nineteen Tilts Listed on '46-47 Basketball Slate

Mr. Eugene Oberst, University Athletic Director, early this month released the John Carroll 1946-47 basketball slate of games scheduled to date. Other games will undoubtedly be added to the schedule between now and November but thus far the Streaks are slated for home-and-home series with Penn, Wooster, Baldwin-Wallace, Case, Akron, Kent and Youngstown. Single clashes are set with Duquesne, Western Reserve, Oberlin, Gannon and Hiram as opponents.

Carroll's home games will be played in the University gym, at Latin gym and at the Arena. The first B-W game and the meeting with Duquesne are to be played at the Arena as part of Al Sutphin's program to put Cleveland college basketball games on a par with cities like Buffalo and New York City where huge throngs turn out in Civic Auditorium and Madison Square Garden to watch local and intersectional cage teams in action.

Hunt Takes Over As Carroll Publicity Head

Jack Hunt, former basketball star and assistant cage coach, has returned to the campus as head of the University publicity department.

Hunt attended East High school and entered Carroll in 1936. Following his graduation in 1941, he entered the Army and served in the infantry for three years as a physical instructor. Discharged this year, Jack was mustered out as a first lieutenant. Jack, who is 26, is married and lives in Willoughby. His wife is the former Antoinette Miller of Louisville, Ky. The couple were married in

1943 while Jack was in the Army.

While a student at Carroll, Jack was very active in campus activities. He was on the News staff, in the Commerce Club, a member of the Little Theatre Society and sang in the Glee Club. However, alumni and students remember Hunt most as a basketball player. Never to be forgotten was Jack's "Frank Merriwell" long shot from the middle of the court which beat a highly-touted Bowling Green quintet in the final seconds when the Streak eagers met the Staters a few years back. In the interim between graduation and the Army call, Hunt coached the freshman basketball squad.

DT'S Take I-M Softball Title from Blue Bells
