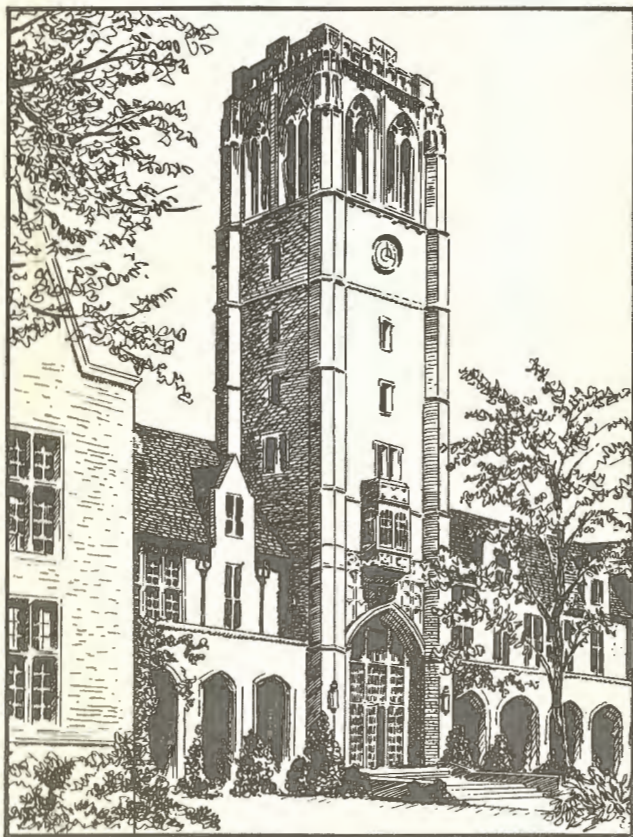

## COMMENCEMENT DINNER ADDRESS

George V. Voinovich  
Cuyahoga County Auditor

Our speaker, George Voinovich, has been Cuyahoga County Auditor since November of 1971.

He is a native Clevelander who graduated from Collinwood High School and received his undergraduate degree in government from Ohio University. He then received his Juris Doctorate from the Ohio University College of Law. He is married and the father of four children.

He served as an Assistant Ohio Attorney General and was elected for three consecutive terms to the Ohio House of Representatives, where he sponsored 85 bills that became law. George Voinovich was the ranking Cuyahoga County Republican on the House Finance Appropriations Committee.

He is a member of the Ohio, Cuyahoga County and Cleveland Bar Associations, a member of the American Society of Public Administrators, the International Association of Assessing Officers and the Municipal Finance Officers Association. He is Past President of the Northeast Kiwanis Club, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Cleveland Y.M.C.A., Vice-Chairman of the Pacesetter Boy Scout District and a member of the Board of Trustees of the United Torch Agency.

For four consecutive years he was selected as one of the ten outstanding young men in the Greater Cleveland area by the Cleveland Jaycees and in 1970 he was named one of five outstanding young men in Ohio by the Ohio Jaycees.

In addition to carrying out his responsibilities as County Auditor, Mr. Voinovich has been an active lobbyist in Columbus on behalf of real estate taxpayers. As Chairman of the Auditors' Legislative Task Force Committee in 1972 he was instrumental in preventing the Board of Tax Appeals from increasing taxes in Cuyahoga County by 25%. He was a key factor in liberalizing the provisions in Ohio's Homestead Act which gives tax relief to Senior Citizens.

You are probably familiar with his investigation that led to the conviction of five persons guilty of fraud in the handling of Soldiers Relief Commission orders.

He is the first county official in the history of Cuyahoga County to institute a complete management study of his office and has called public attention to the waste of tax dollars in the construction of the Justice Center.

## THE ASSOCIATE IN PROFESSIONAL MANAGEMENT DEGREE PROGRAM

This ceremony marks the completion of the eighth class of the Associate in Professional Management Degree program presented by John Carroll University's School of Business. This program was conceived in the belief that the strength of the nation's business depends, for a large part, upon the continuous upgrading of managerial potentials so as to meet the dynamic needs of an expanding economy.

The program is especially designed to provide educational opportunities for those individuals who, having experienced several years of management responsibility, are motivated toward furthering the development of their expertise so that they may effectively command far greater responsibility within the business community.

The curriculum offers concentrated study in the functional areas of business including marketing, accounting, finance, decision making, and economics. Human areas examine intrapersonal behavior, group dynamics, leadership, communication and motivation. These topical areas are interwoven with investigations of the social, economic, and political environment of business. All of which, augmented with an analysis of managerial and organizational theory, direct the candidate toward the development of a dynamic and personal philosophy of management.

Let the light of Thy divine wisdom direct the deliberations of the Congress, and shine forth in all the proceedings and laws framed for our rule and government; so that they may tend to the preservation of peace, the promotion of national happiness, the increase of industry, sobriety, and useful knowledge, and may perpetuate to us the blessings of equal liberty.*

*We pray for his Excellency, the Governor of this State, for the members of the Assembly, for all judges, magistrates, and other officers who are appointed to guard our political welfare; that they may be enabled, by Thy powerful protection, to discharge the duties of their respective stations with honesty and ability.*

*We recommend likewise to Thy unbounded mercy all our brethren and fellow-citizens, throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge, and sanctified in the observance of Thy most holy law; that they may be preserved in union and in that peace which the world cannot give; and, after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal.*
