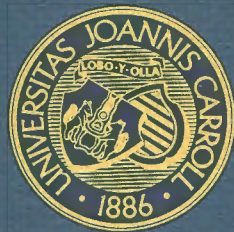

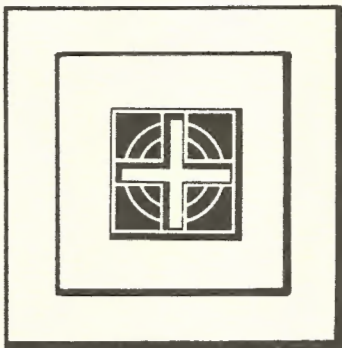

Profession of Faith

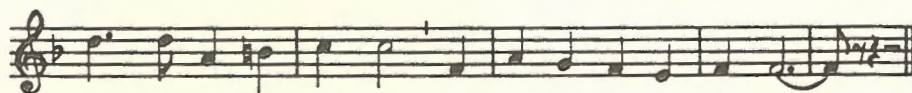
